Colton Parish Food Bank Appeal

Once again Colton Parish Council is supporting the annual Christmas Foodbank Appeal running from 8th - 13th December. Donations to the foodbank have been dropping in recent months, so as well as seasonal treats, the basics would be greatly appreciated, e.g. long-life milk, dried goods, tinned fruit and vegetables, and toiletries. We have collection points in all the villages in Colton Parish so check out local noticeboards for details. CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

Within sight of the city of Bethlehem lie the ruins of Herodium, the palace of Herod the Great. It is an astonishing place, built in a desert, on top of an artificial hill, with its own water system channelled in. There are mosaics on the floors, a Roman bathhouse (with both heated and cold water), a theatre, and frescoes painted on the walls depicting exotic locations - scenes of Egypt and Italy identifiable amongst them. From what remains, and it continues to be excavated, it is clear that Herod's palace was a place of enormous opulence. It is no real wonder, then, that Magi from the East came to Herod looking for the newborn king - expecting him to be in that luxurious place of fluffy pillows and soft beds; and yet, when God Himself came to live amongst us, it was not in the comfortable palace. It was less than 4 miles away, in a dank, dark, smelly stable. No mosaics - only dirty straw. No beautiful bathhouse - only water for the animals. No theatre - only a visit from the shepherds. No frescoes - only a guttering oil lamp. I cannot really imagine that lying her new baby in a trough full of spiky hay was an easy decision for Mary - no matter how sweet 'Away in a Manger' makes it sound. But that's how and where God chose to come amongst us: quietly, in messiness and chaos. We so often want Christmas to be picture perfect - like the John Lewis ad says it should be. However, God comes among us, not loudly in luxury, but quietly in chaos.

Whatever messiness December and January throw your way, may you know the peace of Emmanuel - the God who dwells with us.
