Dear Friends,

I love stories. For example, when I was at secondary school (a little while ago now) there was a boy called Mike who was very talented, especially at football, but had no apparent interest in Christian things. Several years passed and then, out of the blue apparently, there was a brief entry in the old boys' section of the school magazine. In it, Mike said that he and his family had recently attended a Billy Graham crusade (I did say that this story was set in the past), they had made a commitment and now lived their lives by a different set of principles.

Another true story is told by David Adam who was once the vicar of the Holy Island of Lindisfarne. At noon one August day a group of about 20 young people arrived, went to the front of church and knelt except for one young woman who stood with her arms raised in prayer. Within moments the church became silent with an air of expectancy. After a while they rose, bowed and left. David as vicar was curious and followed quickly to greet them. Only one of the group spoke English and said "We're from Slovakia. To celebrate our new freedom as Christians we sought out one of the holiest places we had heard of and came to give thanks to God. I hope we did not disturb anyone." "Thank you," David replied "I believe that you have disturbed us all by revealing the presence of God who is ever with us. God bless you all on your journey." May God's presence touch and bring Christian hope to our lives and to the lives of any in particular need.
