DALE PARK WEATHER

No-one will be surprised to learn that September is so far the wettest month of the year with more than 10" of rain to the 24th and only 5 dry days.

The August total rainfall was 6.97" and 17 dry days. 2024 figures are the opposite of this year. August had 11.69" and 7 dry days and September 4.77" and 12 dry days. Total rainfall so far this year is 53.32" with 136 dry days. Last year's total rainfall at this point was 67" and only 96 dry days.
