OXEN PARK CINEMA CLUB





LICENSING ACT 2003:

APPLICATION FOR A GRANT OF A PREMISES LICENCE

Satterthwaite Parochial Church Council has applied to South Lakeland District Council for a Grant of a Premises Licence for Satterthwaite Parish Room to allow the holding of Regulated Entertainment to include:- Music, Singing, Dancing, Live performers, Playing of recorded sound, Sporting/game competitions in the presence of an audience (including but not limited to, darts and snooker/pool etc). Other forms of live dance, Performance of a play and late night refreshment between the hours of 0900 and 0300 daily. The proposed latest terminal time for the provision of regulated entertainment, late night refreshment and closure of the premises will be 0300. Any person intending to make relevant representations on this application should submit them in writing by not later than 21 December 2006 to the Licensing Manager, Licensing Section, South Lakeland District Council, South Lakeland House, Lowther Street, Kendal, Cumbria LA9 4UQ or by emailing licensing@southlakeland.gov.uk. The full application, including details of the proposed Grant may be viewed at The Old Vicarage, Satterthwaite between 10.00 am and 4.00 pm Monday to Friday. IT IS AN OFFENCE, knowingly or recklessly to make a false statement in connection with an application for which you may be liable to a fine of up to £5000 on summary conviction.

Church News

Dear Friends,

I once read Christmas described as a cross and a woolly hippopotamus. I felt that some explanation was needed and thankfully it was provided. The writer had just been to a Christmas service, but it was not an ordinary service. Normally the altar in his church was simple and uncluttered- just a cross and a Bible (and bread and wine at communion services) but at this service things were different. The table was nearly covered, the cross almost obscured. There were two woolly hippos, several dolls, a whole family of teddy bears, a furry rabbit, boxes, books and crayons. It was a Toy Service. That is not to say that it was a chance for toys to celebrate Christmas. Instead the toys were gifts from the congregation to a local centre helping children with severe learning difficulties.

On the altar were woolly hippos and a cross. It seems a rather odd contrast, but below the superficial difference there is a deeper similarity. Both are expressions of love, both make the incarnation a reality. Both point to the truth that God cares, that he stands with the weak and vulnerable. Christmas should always be a reminder that God gives himself to the world through his Son. God is not remote and distant: he is intimately involved in the life of our world, he is there in the nitty-gritty and the eccentricities.

Sometimes theology seems so abstract and remote, yet the reality of love is simple and concrete. And can be expressed as well in a woolly hippo as anything else.

I look forward to seeing some of you at the carol service at Rusland on 17th December and at either Rusland or Satterthwaite on Christmas Day. I wish all of you a very happy Christmas and New Year.
