'TIS THE SEASON!

CUBBY'S TARN

On a sparkling sunny Sunday in early November, a large group of friends and family of the late John Cubby gathered by a hidden tarn in a quiet corner of the Forest to commemorate the life of this much-loved man, who died so tragically last year. John was the Head Wildlife Ranger for the Forestry Commission in NW England, and was recognised throughout the country for his deep understanding and love of wildlife. He was awarded the MBE for his services to wildlife conservation. Grizedale Forest was his natural home, and so the Forestry Commission here has dedicated and renamed the tarn in his name as a permanent memorial. Senior members of the Commission paid glowing tributes, before declaring open the new wildlife viewing hide. Then John's brother and brother-in-law re-named the tarn, and revealed the memorial stone and plaque, the inscription on which reads:

'Cubby's Tarn'

In loving Memory of John James Cubby MBE
1938 - 2007

The 'Gentleman of the Woods' who's outstanding work in wildlife conservation and wonderful character will never be forgotten. Your work will always inspire those who follow.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Council has already formally expressed its concern about the proposed wind-farm at Stribers on the Cartmel peninsula, because of the visual impact on views from the Parish. The wind-farm company, 'Energia in Natura', spoke at our October meeting, and the STOP campaign against the turbines has been invited to speak at our December 1st meeting. The Council's decision on any planning application will follow.

In his presentation on the proposed wind-farm, Mr Bob Ayres explained that the company was monitoring wind speed, assessing the visual impact of the turbines and estimating potential noise levels. Their surveys had shown that ecological harm was unlikely as was any negative affect on tourism. In response to questions he said that any decommissioning would be a condition of planning; off-shore wind farms were expensive to connect to the grid; turbines cost £1.3M with a life of 20-25yrs; government grants for wind-farms were "significant" but linked to performance; wind farms were compatible with hill-farming; and any further turbines would be unlikely as 5-6 was the optimum number for the site.

Sadly, the red phone box at Oxen Park is due to be removed by BT as it is rarely used. Your Council considered the BT 'Adopt-a-kiosk' scheme, but the cost of retaining the compulsory electricity supply to the light (£40 per year) and any future disconnection charge (£100's) was too much of a financial commitment.

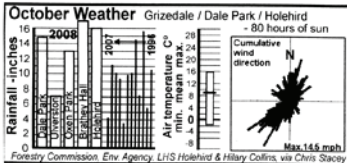
CHESS CLUB

There are many stories and jokes about school nativity plays. One of many such stories, is the one in which the small shepherds (wearing dressing gowns and tea towels of course) stumble on to the stage to kneel around the baby Jesus. Now, these shepherds have been encouraged by their teacher to use their own words to act out the story. They shuffle uncomfortably. They look at each other and they look at the baby. Eventually one of them speaks: 'Oooh! He looks just like his Dad'.

It was a phrase he'd heard his mother use when admiring the neighbour's new baby. It therefore seemed to be a natural thing to say about this baby they were looking at.
