BBC RECORDS NEW DRAMA IN THE LAKES

A BBC production crew have been on location in Colton, Blawith and Torver recording a new radio drama by Cumbrian writers. 'Heft like the Herdwick' is written by Red Sky Writers- a ten-woman strong writing team from South Lakeland and Furness. On May 23 and 24, actors, sound recording technicians, and Manchester-based producer Nadia Molinari, were recording the new drama and capturing the unique sounds of the Lake District. Actors lined up for the production, include David Hargreaves, Denise Black, Emma Atkins, Emma Rydal, and Neil Ashton.

'Heft like the Herdwick' is set in the fictional Lake District village of Cawthwaite - a place which has always been home to farmer's daughter Katie Muncaster and generations of Muncasters before her. When a body is discovered in the lake, long-buried secrets come with it changing lives in the village for good.

Who are Red Sky Writers? - They are ten Cumbrian women ranging in age from their thirties to their fifties. From running their own businesses to being a Mum, these women wear many hats during the course of their day and in August 2003 they decided to extend that portfolio to include writer. 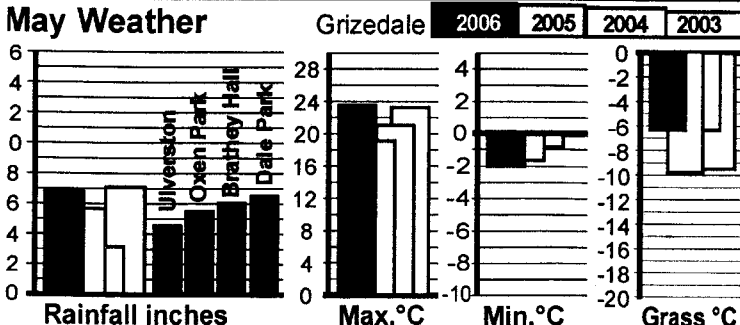

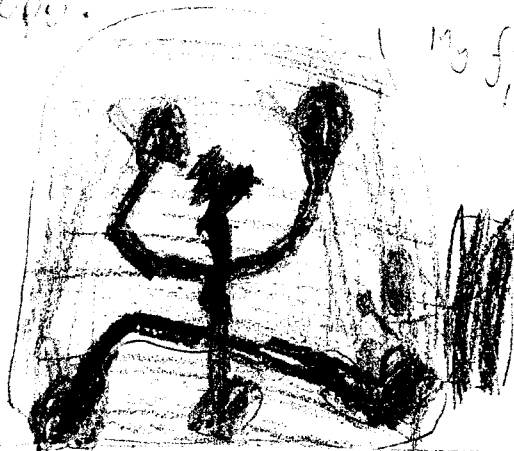

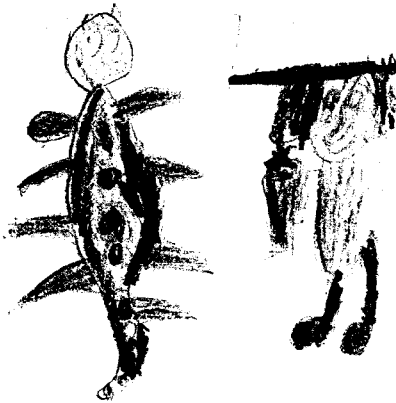
