### SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At our meeting on the 22<sup>nd</sup> January there was lively public debate over the planning application for seasonal camping use of a field at Bowkerstead Farm. The council heard arguments for and against the proposal to open a field next to Grizedale Beck to family tents for the summer, as the tents do not fit in the assigned woodland pitches already approved. After consideration the council supported the application, given the proposed screen planting planned and the fact that uncontrolled camping could go ahead under the "28 day" rule – this being considered less desirable.

A two-storey extension and other alterations at Old Breasty Haw were also supported.

A number of comments were received from the public concerning contractor traffic connected with the Grizedale development. In discussion it was agreed that most activity is perfectly legal and to be expected, but parishioners who encounter any illegal or dangerous activity can contact the Grizedale Project Manager, Mark Street, or anyone on the Grizedale Consultative Committee chaired by Ron Mein. Our representative is Liz Cringle.

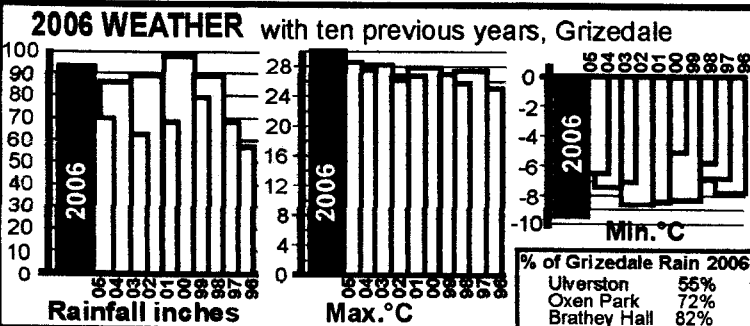

## Church News

Dear Friends

After church last Sunday, which was the first Sunday in Lent, somebody talked to me about the Church of England 'Lent Lite' campaign, something which had somehow passed me by. According to The Times online, a Church of England spokesman has said: "Traditionally Lent has been seen as a sombre time of sackcloth and ashes. What we are suggesting is that people share jokes, which is a way of kickstarting a very positive take on the season." The debate this has sparked is interesting. Some people are all in favour, rightly pointing out that our faith is one of joy, celebration and hope. Others have been rather less enthusiastic, rightly pointing out that Lent is a time for taking our faith seriously. Unfortunately some people seem to believe that Christian discipline is completely incompatible with humour, which is sad. I am pleased to report though that church life is full of humour, and at least some of it is deliberate. Laughter is one of the most precious gifts that we have.

And perhaps it can help us look more objectively at ourselves. One of the problems with Lent is that often it is used as an excuse to diet or not diet, to take more exercise or less exercise. In other words it is used to focus attention on ourselves and it can become a kind of inverted luxury, a way of pampering ourselves, another way of putting me first. This is not the point of Lent. In fact it is the opposite of the point.

Perhaps a good laugh may help us see beyond the narrow limits of our own lives.
