#### RAINFALL

The March figures are: -

Ulverston 3.1", Oxen Park 9.7" and Brathay 14.6"
The Dale Park rainfall for March was 11.11". This is now beginning to look very fortunate, as the total for April to the 26th is only 0.8"! This is the lowest since records began in Dale Park in 2002. April is usually a dry month, the average for the last 15 years being 3.86". Only three Aprils have been over 4", with the wettest 2005 with 6.67". So far in 2017 there have been 39 days without measurable rain, 15 of these being in April.

#### Dear Friends.

On Thursday the 25th May it will be Ascension Day...a very significant time in our season of Easter. When Jesus ascended into heaven he had accomplished all that he had come to do here on earth, it signalled the end of His earthly ministry and it is closely connected with the theme of mission.

Matthew's Gospel ends with Jesus' final words to his disciples, that they should go to all nations and make disciples, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19-20) So what of 'our' mission, our earthly work and earthly ministry?
