SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL - FEBRUARY The road closure at Grizedale was due to ENWL installing electricity cables under the road to prevent more powerline issues. GRIZEDALE STAGES RALLY – GRAHAM PARKER Graham attended the meeting discuss issues with parking at Grizedale Stages rally 2022. Spectators parked on verges down the road from Moortop towards Hawkshead. Due to the unexpected popularity of the night stage Graham had not anticipated the large number of spectators causing rubbish and people using the forest as a toilet. This will be addressed as they are hoping to run the night stages again.

It was discussed whether the campsite could be used for car parking, dependant on the weather.

Houses are being looked at for use by staff. At the moment some of the empty houses are uninhabitable due to damage over the winter months.

Planning applications were received for No 3 The Kennels to convert the building into a more long-lasting building. The Council support this application.

Proposed planning for the mast at Thwaite Moss was received but has not been officially applied for at present. The Council replied to the Telecommunications company asking that they re-think the site as now the trees have been removed the site will be visible and asked that they revisit their plan.

We have had a quote from Sarah Spicer for repairing the road down Nursery Lane this would be £1000, so Gary will contact United Utilities to request the funding.

Once the planning application has been submitted for the proposed car park in Satterthwaite the Council will apply for grants for funding.

Gary has sent in an application for a grant for batteries for the proposed solar panels for the village warm space which is designated as the Eagles Head.

Dear Friends,

I wonder what we mean by the word 'faith' when used in a religious context. Our first thought, maybe, is that it means more or less the same as the word 'belief', perhaps specifically belief in something despite lack of evidence. It is no secret that I have been exploring the Christian faith for some time, and I have come to understand faith to mean much more than belief. Belief is part of it certainly, but not the end of the story by any means.

I see faith not as a destination but as a journey, not as a formula but as a relationship, not as an absolute but as an unfolding adventure. During that adventure we discover a confidence and trust that we are exploring something which is full of truth and beauty and love.

To help us with this we have the church and our worship. And we also have the Bible. I don't approach the Bible as some sort of manual of rules and regulations, but rather a mix of story, poetry, dialogue and history which captures the incredible, life-giving journey of faith: firstly, of the people of Israel, then of those who encountered Jesus, became followers and started the church. As we prayerfully read the stories of faith and make the stories of scripture our story, we find the passages have the power to open our eyes, to break down barriers and to bring us purpose and peace. This month will see the coronation of King Charles III, and we will discover once again the central part that faith has played and still plays in our society.
