COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Deer Poaching and Rural Crime: Colton and Satterthwaite Parish Councils are very pleased to report their successful bid for a grant from the Police and Crime Commissioner's Community Fund to help combat the increasing problem of deer poaching in Rusland and Grizedale.

Signpost at Rusland: At last, we are delighted to see a replacement signpost in place at the turn to Rusland Church, which includes a sign to 'Grizedale'. This will hopefully help to stop vehicles heading for Grizedale turning towards Thwaite Moss and attempting to take the unmetalled road to Force Mills. The only remaining issue is that there is still no Grizedale sign for the right turn at Rusland Vicarage, causing traffic to continue south to Oxen Park. We had requested this as well, and hope it will be added before long.

YMCA Lakeside: The planning application for development of YMCA Lakeside (7/2013/5621) included a Construction Traffic Management Plan as a result of some concerns expressed by local residents and the Parish Council about traffic along this busy and constricted route from Newby Bridge. The Plan now incorporates our recommendations which include limiting travel times for works staff and tradesmen to the start and end of day, and appointing a Site Traffic Management Officer to manage construction traffic, monitor compliance and liaise with the Parish Council and residents living along the route.

Parish Council's Community Grant: Three village halls benefitted from your Parish Council's Community small grant scheme: Finsthwaite & Lakeside Village Hall for a digital projector, Rusland Reading Rooms for a hand dryer, and Oxen Park Reading Rooms for lighting and a vacuum-cleaner. This is likely to be an annual fund allocation, so look out for a call for grant applications next summer.

Our next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 5th December in Rusland Reading Rooms, 7pm

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Local Crimes - There has been an increase in crime in the valley, including damaged gates on Forestry Commission land at two forest access points, which was reported via 999. Police attended within 20 minutes of the incident having been reported but no vehicles were seen, there was also damage to a gate on land belonging to Force Forge Farm, the second incident in this area. Poaching is also on the increase and Alistair Boston of the Deer Initiative, reported that there have been 17 deer carcasses or remains found within a three-mile radius of Rusland Church and believes that this is only a small percentage of deer being poached.

In instances when witnesses to crimes said they had tried to ring 101 this proved unsatisfactory, as reports were often not logged correctly and occasionally not logged at all. This has led Colton Parish Council to apply for funding of approx. £8000 with the support of local landowners and organisations including Satterthwaite Parish Council, to help prevent and record incidents. Installation of cameras in parish villages as well as increased support from the Cumbria constabulary was mentioned. A group has been set up to discuss the way forward. We are hoping to get more help from the Police technical support to let us know what is possible and within the law.

Planning - Planning application for Deer Leap on East of Lake Road are being looked at by the Council, there are currently problems with the planning web page, this will be commented on at the next meeting once the planning application has been reviewed. There is also a planning application for Hawkrigg in Satterthwaite.

Possible Car Park in Satterthwaite - A questionnaire is being set up to be distributed to residents of Satterthwaite to find out their views of the car park plan for Satterthwaite and whether they feel extra parking is required in the village.

Highways - The Parish Council has responded to comments from residents of Satterthwaite regarding the lack of white lines at Force Forge and reported this problem to the Highways Agency, they are going to arrange for the white lines to be reinstated as they were before the roadworks were done.

Gary Thomason attended the Southern Area Planning meeting where Parish Councils are being encouraged to promote building low cost housing for local occupancy. SLDC are approving more planning permissions that ever before, for Housing Associations who are either renting or purchasing land in the South lakes area to build and rent out affordable houses for local residency.

A vote was taken by the Parish Councillors between two candidates for a new parish councillor. Mike Thornley was the successful candidate.

Next Meeting will be on Monday 21st November at 7.30pm in the Forestry Commission Office's at Grizedale.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends,

It is a mystery of the human condition that we are so concerned with what other people think about us. How people respond to us matters more than we would ever like to admit. If they are amused at our jokes, we begin to think that we are funny. If they praise us, we become more convinced of our value. But if they avoid our gaze as we enter a room, or look impatient when we are talking, or constantly criticise us, we may begin to have feelings of self-doubt and worthlessness. You might think that we would be happy to receive some nice care and attention from just a few people, but it seems that if anybody ignores us or apparently does not like or respect us, then we are hurt. I suspect that this is as true of people living in the Rusland valley as it is of people working in the central London.

In an ideal world we would not mind so much. We would be unshaken whether we were ignored or noticed, praised or jeered at. We would know our own worth and value and not worry about what other people thought. But to a large extent we still define ourselves by what other people think.

I believe that Christians have one great advantage. We know what the greatest being in the Universe thinks of us. It was one of Jesus' central claims that all human beings, however slow-witted, untalented and obscure we seem to ourselves, are creatures of God and loved by him. This is an audacious challenge to the world's assumption that some people are great and some are mediocre. There are no human beings outside the circle of God's love.
