SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The council last met on 10th September. Unable to attend PCSO Emma Forrester submitted a written report for period 1st August to 7th September: there were no crimes reported to Cumbria Police during that period. There have been numerous reports in the Hawkshead area relating to vehicles including speeding, parking and concerns over size of vehicle but it is likely that now the summer period is coming to an end there will be a reduction in traffic levels.

In the Lakes area there is a popular scam causing concern. It involves a letter being sent to residents from a Chinese person stating a relative (whom they name in the letter) of the resident has recently passed away in a foreign country and a large amount of money has been bequeathed to the resident. These letters should be thrown away. Generally, Cumbria Constabulary and Trading Standards strongly advise residents to refuse to entertain cold callers on their doorstep

A re-design of proposed car park layout with alterations to tidy-up the back of the field to create 17/18 bays with possibly an extra one at the back entrance to the church was discussed. This should greatly ease the need for parking on the main road. A detailed plan is being worked for the Planning Authority. The covenant on the field was considered but it is unlikely that the Forestry Commission will enforce any restrictions on the field. Before any work is done councillors will need to be satisfied that there will be little or no disruption of a natural habitat and determined that if trees need to be removed they will be replaced.

A councillor attended the Rusland Show to promote the Community Plan but the weather was poor and though there was some interest no new helpers came forward. It was agreed to organise a first meeting of locals interested in the Plan.

An update on work done by David Walker, the lengthsman, was presented and, money permitting, work will be done from the Grizedale Lodge upwards to the moor where flooding is known to occur. A request was made for some work to be done at Cunsey.

The news from the Local Access Partnership meeting of 11 July was that the commercial roll out of superfast broadband will cover towns and cities in the county.

The council will pursue the parish's interest in broadband.

The Neighbourhood Forum is to be replaced with a grant panel to distribute money from county councillors.

The next Meeting of Satterthwaite Parish Council will be on Tuesday 22nd October at 7.30pm in the Parish Room. Public and press always welcome.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Flooding at Finsthwaite, Stott Park and Lakeside: The torrential rain on Monday 5th August saw severe flooding at the eastern side of our Parish – in Finsthwaite, Stott Park and Lakeside. At least 2 houses were badly flooded and a car was written off in Stott Park where the flood was estimated to be some three feet deep. Our local Councillor is to contact the Cumbria Local Flood Risk Management Team who brings the various agencies together to solve problems. This approach has been successful in other areas prone to flooding.

The pilot "Finsthwaite Community Resilience" project, initiated by Councillor Vanessa Champion, was put to its first proper test during the floods, and the channels of communication operated very well. More information about this project will be provided in due course as we anticipate that other communities might want to follow suit.

Rural Surgeries: Your Council is writing in support of rural surgeries threatened with possible closure due to withdrawal of government grant. Many Colton residents attend Hawkshead surgery. Tim Farron MP is fully supportive of efforts to retain these important services, saying in response to a letter from Hawkshead Parish Council: "I entirely share your sentiments that our invaluable rural practices MUST be rescued to continue to serve the health needs of communities like yours."

Highways: We are not sure what happened to the 'Better Highways' initiative. The promised visits from Highways teams have not materialized for over a year now, and this seems to be the experience of most South Lakeland parishes. Our new County Councillor, David Fletcher, will be attending a meeting this month of the County's South Lakes Local Committee at which he hopes to find out more. Emergency repairs are, however, being carried out and the Tottlebank to Toll-bar road has been patched recently. Residents should contact the Highways Hotline (Tel: 0845 609 6609 or email:

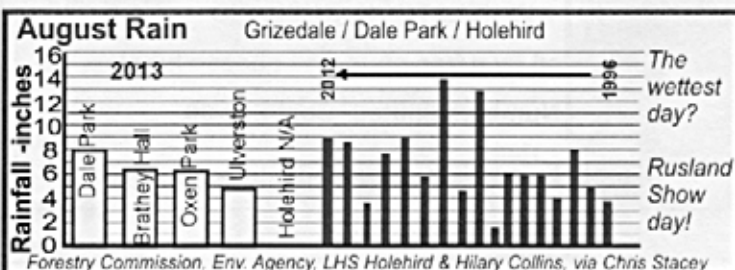

PAYDAY LOANS: KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

Do you know someone who's having a problem with a Payday loan? Every day Citizens Advice helps on average 60 people with their Payday loan problems, so it's possible you know someone who is having a problem right now.

Advice tips if you're struggling to repay a payday loan:

- Your payday lender should accept a repayment offer which is reasonable
- Don't be pressurised to extend your loan – it will cost you more
- It's not OK for your lender to ring you during the night or more than once a day chasing you for money, or to contact your employer
- You should be able to get in contact with your payday lender

3 in 4 payday borrowers who got advice from the national Citizens Advice consumer service had been treated unfairly by their lender and had grounds for an official complaint to the Financial Ombudsman Service.
