LIKE RUSLAND HORIZONS

Local film-makers, Whitewood & Fleming, have been commissioned to make a short film about the Rusland Horizons scheme and its role in the local area. MAJOR CHANGES TO VEHICLE ROAD TAX

From 1 October 2014, there are 3 changes:

- the paper road tax disc will no longer be issued as the DVLA computer record is sufficient for the Police to know who has a valid tax disc (so no more paper tax discs in windscreens).
- if you sell a vehicle and you have notified DVLA, you will automatically get a refund for any full calendar months left on the vehicle tax.
- when you buy a vehicle, the vehicle tax will no longer be transferred with the vehicle, so you will need to get new vehicle tax before you can use the vehicle, using the New Keeper Supplement (V5C/2) part of the vehicle registration certificate (V5C) by phone 0300-790-6801 or online at:

From 1 November, motorists can choose to pay by direct debit. Provided an MOT remains valid, the payments will continue automatically until you cancel the Direct Debit with your bank, or tell DVLA to stop taking them, or a Statutory Off Road Notification (SORN) has been made. Apply online using the details above and your unique reference number given on your DVLA reminder sent in the post.

Another change is the option to pay monthly, as well as the existing annual and biennial options. There's no surcharge for an annual license, otherwise an admin charge of 5% will be added. **BUT YOU CAN STILL SORT OUT YOUR VEHICLE TAX AT A POST OFFICE!**

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

Satterthwaite Parish Council will meet next on Tuesday 28th October 2014 at 7.30pm in the Parish Room. Members of the public are welcome. At the meeting on 16th September, an emailed report from PCSO Emma Forrester for the period 25/07–16/09/2014 was considered:

There were no crimes reported to Cumbria Police during this period. One Mountain Cave Rescue and a single theft (under investigation and not a confirmed crime as yet) were the only other items.

PCSO Forrester wrote: You'll be aware from the news of the following. Please be assured that the threat level has been raised for the whole of the UK and there are no areas specifically at risk. It is important for us all to be vigilant and to raise any concerns appropriately. The Joint Terrorism Analysis Centre has raised the UK National Threat Level to SEVERE; an attack is highly likely. The threat to the UK from international terrorism has increased, and has been driven by developments in Syria and Iraq. The situation there is providing an environment for terrorist groups, including the Islamic State (formerly ISIL) and Al Qaida (AQ)-linked groups, to plan attacks against the West. The availability of a large pool of individuals that have travelled from the UK and Europe to Syria heightens this threat. As these individuals return to the UK, there is a risk that a terrorist group will have tasked them to conduct attacks or that they will seek to conduct attacks on their own initiative.

UK policing has been operating at SUBSTANTIAL: an attack will be a strong possibility for several years, and while the threat level increase to SEVERE: an attack is highly likely is a step up, it is within the capability and capacity of business as usual. Reports can be made via the Anti-terrorist hotline: 0800 789 321. If you have any concerns that you wish to discuss locally in the first instance, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Councillor Thornley is to negotiate purchase of seat made by local craftsman for the Recreation and Play Area; and, Councillor Elkington-Crabtree said the Community Plan working group had devised a simple questionnaire for easy distribution and retrieval. There were two planning issues the PC resolved to support: 1) the Temporary Closure of public rights of way for motor sports events 22nd Nov 2014 & 7th March 2015, 2) the Rights of Way change through High Dale Park.

Our November films are '*Philomena*' on 4th and *The Selfish Giant* on 15th – more dates for you diary.

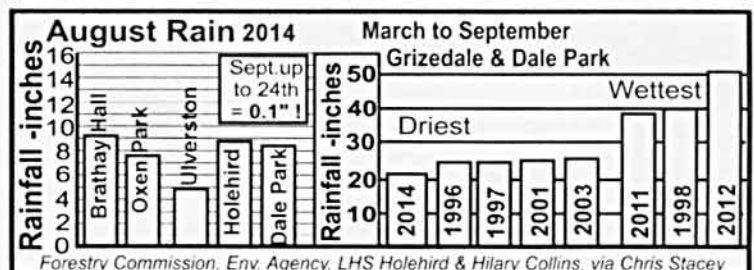
COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Electoral Registration Changes: Residents should all have received a letter from South Lakeland District Council about changes to the way you register to vote. This change gets rid of the outdated 'head of household' registration system and places electoral registration in the hands of individuals. The letter explains that you will have been automatically re-registered under the new system.

Opting-out of the 'Open Register': The letter also explains that there are (and have been for some time) two registers: the 'full register', used for electoral purposes only, and the 'open register', which can be bought from SLDC by any person, company or organisation and can be used for any number of purposes, including direct marketing. Both registers contain the same information, but individuals may ask for their details to be removed from the open register. If you do not want your details sold in this way, then you must 'opt-out' of the open register. To do this, email optout@southlakeland.gov.uk giving your name, address and contact details. See http://ico.org.uk/for_the_public/topic_specific_guides/electoral_register for a helpful explanation.

Dear Friends,

Trying to live ethically can be a complicated business. If I were to buy a bunch of roses, I do not know whether I am doing right by buying fair-traded roses from Kenya, or wrong because of carbon emissions created by flying them to England; right by helping a Third World country or wrong by ignoring locally-grown flowers. And if I cannot even sort out the rights and wrongs of a bunch of roses, I for one am very cautious about pronouncing on economic issues which I do not begin to understand.

Nevertheless, the Bible insists that we do not forget the first principles of justice and equity. Both Isaiah and Micah in the Old Testament had a vision of how, if we would only follow God's way and God's law, swords could be beaten into ploughshares and there could be plenty for all.

It is never too late to work instead for the justice and the peace and righteousness of God. However we conduct our affairs, whether as a community here or as a nation, we must do it with a vision of justice and peace for all.
