CITIZENS ADVICE TRAVEL TIPS

Q: I'm planning a long holiday and have been struggling to find travel insurance for a reasonable price. I've found a good deal from a Facebook advert but my friend thinks it might be a scam. How can I be sure if it's legitimate?

A: Your friend is right - you should do some research on the company first.

Insurance sellers must be registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) - check on the FCA website. If they aren't listed, don't use them. If they are, it's still worth doing further checks. Compare the price to similar offers from competitors. Big discounts are often a telltale sign of a scam, but the policy could be cheap because it doesn't provide adequate cover. Ask for a copy of the full policy so you can check what you will get. If the seller won't provide one upfront, don't use them. Once you know the seller is legitimate use a secure payment method, not a bank transfer.

MOVING MOUNTAINS

Dave Tomlinson (currently a north London vicar, and previously the founder of Holy Joes, a church in a pub) has written an intriguing book 'How to be a bad Christian ... And a better human being'.

He writes "Life consists of two journeys: the outward journey of the body through time and space, and an inner journey of the soul. The outward journey creates the shell of our existence: where we live, what sort of work we do, whether or not we have a partner, what sort of things we spend our time on, all of which are very important aspects of our life. But the inner journey focuses on creating depth to our existence: discovering who we really are, establishing a sense of meaning and purpose to life, finding our moral and spiritual compass, deciding what it is that drives us."

He adds"I have respect for all faith traditions but for me it is Jesus who shows us God most decisively. At the centre of Jesus' message is a vision of what the world would be like if God were in charge instead of the authorities and politicians. It's a vision of justice, love and reconciliation, a culture of hope and freedom that I continually sign up for and try to represent." Thoughtful words.

From the 8th to 11th March next year Cumbria is hosting a Christian mission, called Moving Mountains, which seeks to speak to our 'inner journeys' in ways that are refreshing and challenging. A number of the mission team will be staying locally and will take part in a range of activities (including, hopefully, a Q&A session with the Archbishop of York) which will be open to everyone – whatever their background or faith position. 
